Her studies have been with such artists as Gyorgy Sandor, Martin Katz, Allen Rogers, and Gary Steigerwalt.

Richard Lalli is Associate Professor of Music (Adjunct) in the Department of Music. Mr. Lalli performs frequently as singer and pianist around the world, and has particular interests in early music, German Lieder, and contemporary American song. He is director of the Yale Collegium Musicum.
